MEETING INFORMATION:

Attendees were greeted at the door, given handouts, and directed to the graphic materials and project team members who could answer their questions and listen to their comments. The meeting proceeded as an open house until 7:40 pm. At that time Joel Stout gave a presentation of general project information, current status, future plans, overview of the DSR design elements. At the end of the presentation, the open house format continued until the close of the meeting.

Questions/Comments Made at the Meeting

A question was asked about the width of the Patterson Street ROW at 4th Avenue. The project team was unable to answer the question since 4th Avenue is north of the project limits. However it was noted that the Patterson Street ROW appears to be 33' wide immediately north of 6th Avenue.

The owner of a multi-unit building on 6th Avenue had concerns about drainage on her property. The project team will continue to work with her to develop a solution.

A representative of the Municipality's Traffic Department requested that there be some vertical elements in the intersection choker.

A representative of the Northeast Community Council mentioned Council design guidelines that she believed should be used for the project. She requested the following details:

- Lighting that would match that to be used at the new Muldoon middle school.
- Colors of constructed features that would be ANHC Maroon and blueberry, Alaska Botanical Garden green, and ADF&G Sand as a base color (a color at their headquarters building at 15th Avenue.
- Pavement pattern (where used) that would match the transit shelter on the east side of Fred Meyer's

A written comment received at the meeting stated that other streets in the area had greater need for reconstruction than 6th Avenue.
